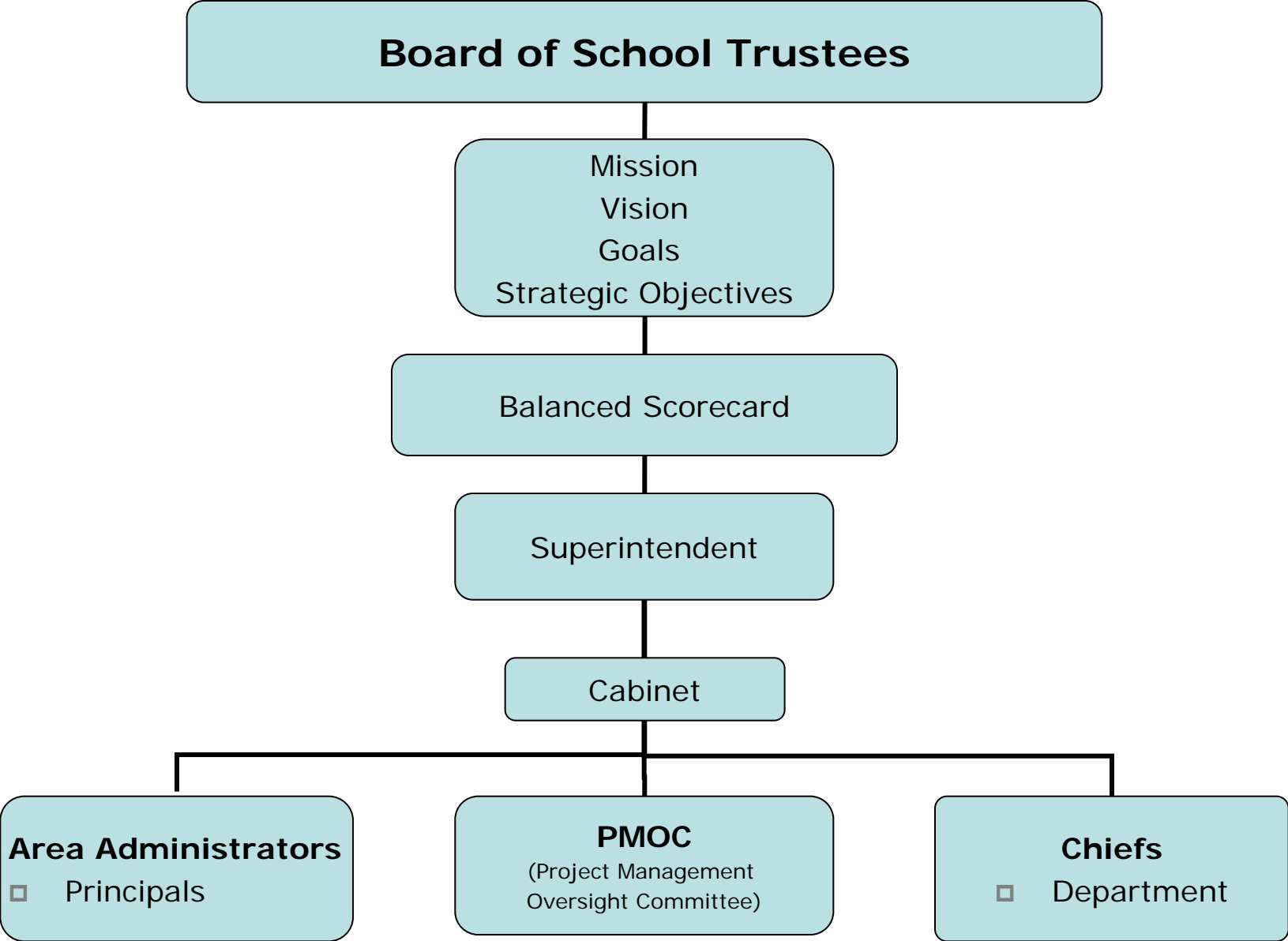

- Project brought to PMOC by a sponsor based on data describing a need for improvement or a new procedure or process to be put in place.
- PMOC meets every Tuesday with projects reporting monthly; the High School Redesign reports bi-weekly given the complexity of the project.

Goal 1- Achieve and Maintain Academic Excellence

- **How schools are using the BSC:**

“I like having the BSC as it keeps all our data in one spot. It is helpful when meeting with teams to discuss student achievement because we can look at progress and targets. QIT uses the BSC when disaggregating data and discussing plans for next year. One example would be that we are implementing 6 min. fluency for the entire building next year during homeroom because of our growth in reading scores as documented in SRI.”

Goal 1- Achieve and Maintain Academic Excellence

- **How schools are using the BSC:**

“The BSC has made South Wayne evaluate what data we collect and how it directly affects the instruction that takes place in the classroom. This has led to very powerful and insightful discussions during grade level and school wide collaboration. It also has been key in developing our SIP through our QIT. The data we collected via the BSC also helps us develop what PD we need to help teachers address through instruction to improve student learning and performance on standardized tests.

The biggest accomplishment we have made is set goals from the data we collected from the BSC. Next year we hope to roll out some of this information to students and set a school wide goal with the students and chart their progress and role in achieving that school wide goal.”

- Software Vendors have provided information
 - Two proposals for demonstration
 - FWCS committee reviewing

- New software will allow us to drill down and roll up the data for easy use by cabinet and principals.
- Some training will be involved, but the work is mainly done by an administrative manager.
- Quarterly reports and summaries can be produced with charts, gauges and speedometers as visuals.
