Related Arts Rotation schedule

This year our elementary related arts schedule is based upon a 6 day rotation. This schedule allows for some additional choice for our 9-12 students and an additional day to extend their learning in a related arts class.

We are entering our second rotation for the 6-9 students. Their “F” day class will be an additional experience in “B” day special. This will rotate through the year approximately every five weeks. 9-12 level students selected two specific elective related arts classes to attend- one each semester.

MONTESSORI MOMENTS...

"The secret of good teaching is to regard the child's intelligence as a fertile field in which seeds may be sown, to grow under the heat of flaming imagination. Our aim therefore is not merely to make the child understand, and still less to force him to memorize, but so to touch his imagination as to enthuse him to his inmost core." Maria Montessori

The math materials are perhaps some of the most beautiful things to look at and to touch in a Montessori Classroom. Students and visitors often gravitate towards them and want to learn how to use them and know more about them. The materials build off one another, starting in preschool all the way to an upper elementary classroom. For example, the pink tower in a 3-6 room is laying the foundation for squaring and cubing in a 9-12 classroom.

In creating the math curriculum, Montessori followed what humans had always been doing. Humans first used fingers to count and keep track of things and then they gave the numbers symbols. Eventually, humans gave the numbers and symbols rules. Montessori starts with this in preschool, while the child is in the first plane of development. The child learns quantity through the red and blue rods. Once mastered, a child begins using the sandpaper numbers to give the quantity a symbol. The child begins to use quantity and symbols together and after much practice, they are introduced to the rules, using beads. As the students move up to lower and upper elementary, they use the materials and begin to see the patterns. After practice and repetition, they are able to find the rule on their own. This allows them to work abstractly with math and move away from the materials and do more written work. Montessori students are introduced to new concepts the way that is natural for humans. They are allowed to think, discover, and look for patterns through repetition and concrete materials.

Classrooms read, discussed, and answered questions about careers, college, and saving for college. 9-12 Cluster students were able to go online and take an interest inventory. The inventory showed them careers and jobs that went along well with their interests. Students were able to research a job, look at education needed, and salary information. We also discussed things that they were practicing now in school that will use in any job in the future (being on time, finishing difficult tasks, getting along with others, time management). Over the next three weeks, all elementary students will be learning how to be safe and how to treat others online.

6-9 students will be discussing non-fiction and fiction. I will read the non-fiction story, "A Penguin Named Patience", which is about how a penguin survived Hurricane Katrina. After hearing the story, the students will explain how this non-fiction story is different from the stories they have heard in previous weeks.

9-12 students are working hard at finding material in the media center. We have watched the Dewey Rap, which is a rap song designed to teach the students how the Dewey Decimal System works. They will be playing a shelving game, where they could win the title of "Master of the Universe." This title will allow them to volunteer in the media center during their recess.

9 – 12 Cluster – These weeks are moving fast and smooth! We have been reviewing numbers 1 -50 orally and 1 – 20 spelling, practicing colors, greetings, calendar and classroom commands. We are also working on memorizing the alphabet and the vowels sounds, and learning some parts of speech like how and when to use **tú** (*you informal*) and **usted** (*you formal*). The students are adapting well to the world language subject environment and the class routine!

MS Classes – We are working on comprehension, writing skills and a variety of hands-on activities related to vocabulary, grammar and culture. There are also on-line quizzes to review spelling and listening which are always part of our daily routine.

More about culture...from September 15 to October 15 is the **National Hispanic Heritage Month** celebration in USA. All the MS students are working on projects to celebrate this event. Partners/small groups are assigned to work on special topics including history, geography, art, music and food. We have an agenda for each week's activities posted by the Spanish class door. We are cooking (*once a week/4th period class only*), making a piñata, decorations, presenting student project, Hispanic visitors, and a Fiesta in the last week.
